Organ & Tissue Donation Facts

- An average of 18 people die each day from the lack of available organs for transplant.
- Every 12 minutes another name is added to the national transplant waiting list.
- One organ donor can save 8 lives.
- One tissue donor can improve the quality of life in 50 individuals.
- All major religions (Christianity, Judaism, Buddhism, Hinduism, and Islam) support organ donation.
- People who donate organs and tissues can still have an open-casket funeral.
- A donor registry is a computerized database of people who wish to be donors when they die. The importance of a registry is that donation intentions can be quickly retrieved 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, whereas a donor card or driver's license may not always be available when someone dies. Your donor registry is the Michigan Donor Registry.
